2009 S.C. Division Convention

This year's annual South Carolina Division Convention of the Sons of Confederate Veterans was held in Anderson on March 20th and 21st. For the Compatriots of Secession Camp it was a long haul but well worth the ride. This years convention was hosted by the Manse Jolly Camp # 6 of Piedmont. After arriving on Friday night attendees were invited to a reception at Ashtabula Plantation featuring a Beaufort stew dinner and some good South Carolina companionship. Then on Saturday morning things got started early at the Anderson Civic Center. A light breakfast was supplied by the OCR and first on the agenda was the morning Memorial Service. After the service compatriots poured into the main auditorium for the days business meetings. Compatriot Ron Wilson, Commander of the Manse Jolly Camp started things off and Division Chaplain Ed Westbury gave the opening prayer. The gathering sang a robust version of Dixie followed by greetings from several local dignitaries and some visiting National SCV commanders. The meeting was then turned over to Commander Randy Burbage and Adjutant Mark Simpson called the roll. Secession Camp had seven members in attendance, **Buck Perry, John Genes, Andy Langdale, Ed Moon, David Rentz, Randy Burbage,** and **Bill Norris**. Commander Burbage announced that he has driven over 7,000 miles and sent and answered thousands of emails and letters in the service of our Division in the past year. 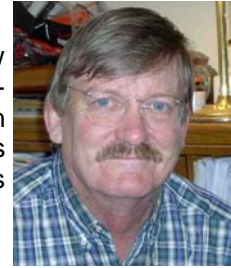

Mickey Davis Fund Report

The Secession Camp # 4 Executive Committee met on April 7, 2009. The following Mickey Davis Fund requests were discussed and are forwarded for posting in the April issue of *The Sentinel* in accordance with the provisions of the Mickey Davis Fund resolution.

Motion

Subject: Crane Scale for the Hunley Lab

I respectfully request expenditure from the Mickey Davis Fund for the amount of \$500.00, to be used as partial payment for a crane scale, to be used for weighing items in the laboratory from the Confederate Submarine Hunley, as well as cannons from the Confederate Raider Alabama, and other artifacts that will be conserved in the same lab.

It is important to be able to weigh individual submarine components that are in excess of the small electric scale presently used. Items include hull plates, keel blocks, concretion, sediment and cannons.

The request is for partial payment for the item requested, whose quote is \$ 1,805.00 plus one pair of 500-5000 lb capacity shackles, \$94.00 for a grand total of \$1,899.00. I will be requesting the remainder of the funding from another source as I do not wish to utilize all of the Mickey Davis Fund available at this time. The second part or additional funding will be sought from the 27th SCVI or other groups.

If in the event that the bid item ends up costing more than planned, or if the either party being requested for funding is unable to commit for any reason, then all monies shall be returned to each party.

McGowan's Brigade defended a section of the battlefield known as the Bloody Angle where some of the longest and most intense fighting of the War Between the States occurred. For up to 20 hours, men were engaged in hand to hand combat and desperate fighting.

- Introduction of guest
- Commander Norris introduced our speaker, John Whatley, Compatriot Whatley is a retired Army artillery officer. He is the author of numerous articles including Military History, Blue and Gray, North and South, And the typical Georgia Confederate. He is a Confederate reenactor and commander of the 1st Brigade Georgia State Line. John spoke about the South Carolina Confederate soldier. He gave a vivid description of the different experience the soldier went through. He told about the different uniforms, transportation used, weapons, baggage taken to war, war itself, and camp life. Training and drill was a necessary part which the soldiers disliked the most. Cadets from the Citadel helped drill the local units around Charleston.

- Chaplains Report: Gene Patrick that Rick Hatcher's mother-is very ill and Rick is currently with her in Virginia. John Dangerfield is recovering from heart problems, and Andy Langdale has received his last, hopefully, Chemo treatment for Cancer.

- New Business: Two new candidates were voted. John Singletary and Michael Dahlman were both approved for membership. Michael Dahlman was inducted and pinned by his grandfather and camp member, Edward Picquet.
- A motion made to adjourn and seconded. The meeting ended with the singing of Dixie.

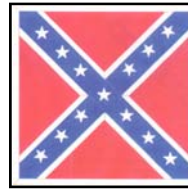

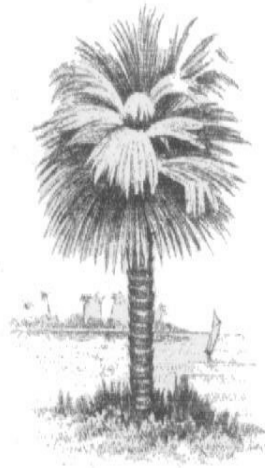

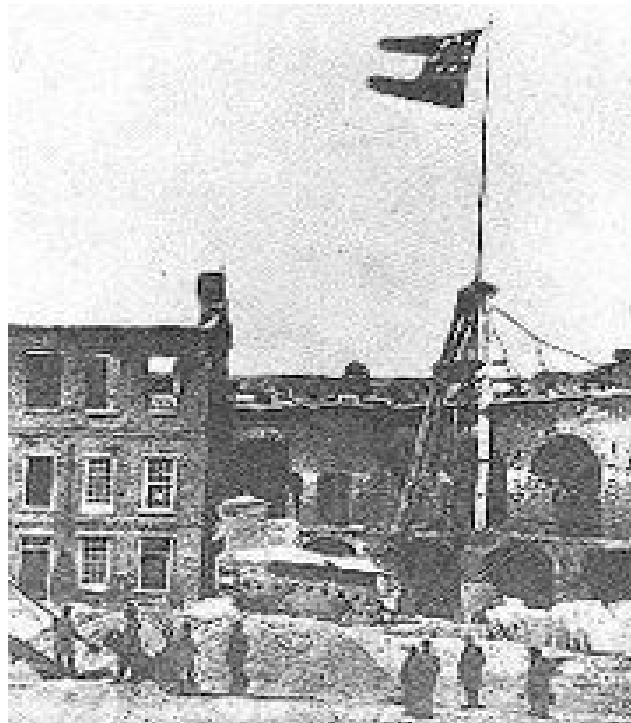
