2008 SCV National Reunion

The 2008 SCV National Reunion was held in Mount Pleasant, NC (near Concord), just outside Charlotte, on July 17th, 18th, and 19th. There were about 300 to 400 members in attendance and business meetings were held from 9 AM to about 1PM each day. Several amendments to the SCV by-laws were considered. The following proposed amendments were defeated by consent: #3 - to create an inactive member status, #4 - to amend the disciplinary process, #5 - concerning GEC minutes, #6 and #7 - to set a fixed day for officer elections, and #8 - concerning the minutes. Amendment #2, containing boilerplate dissolution language required by the IRS passed. Amendment #1, amending the cadet dues and program structure, was referred to a ballot vote on Saturday where it was defeated. Amendment #9, defining conduct unbecoming and requiring administrative remedies be exhausted before any member file suit against the SCV was referred to the GEC. This was also an election year and the South Carolina Division fared very well. Compatriot Michael Givens was elected as Lt. Commander and Compatriot Gene Hogan was elected as ANV Councilman. Our new Commander-in-Chief is Compatriot Chuck McMichael of Louisiana who was elected by acclamation. In other elections Bragg Bowling was elected ANV Commander, Compatriot Todd Owens was elected ATM Commander, Compatriot Paul Gramling was elected ATM Councilman, Compatriot Kelly Barrow was elected AoT Commander, and Compatriot Tom Strain was elected AoT Councilman.

The highlight of the convention was a lecture by Earl J. IJames, a curator at the NC Museum of History. Mr. IJames, a black man, told the story of Wary Clyburn a slave who ran away to join the Confederate Army during the war.

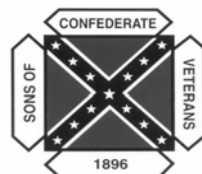

Clyburn became a war hero, saving the life of his master's son on two occasions and even served as an aid to Gen. Robert E. Lee. Clyburn is buried in Monroe, NC at Hillcrest Cemetery not far from the convention site. On Friday afternoon, many convention goers attended a memorial service for him at the Hillcrest Cemetery. Wary's daughter was scheduled to attend but was unable due to illness. However many of Wary's other relatives did attend, including his grandchildren, the youngest of which was 2-year-old Kai Bryant - Wary's great-great granddaughter. Many of these same family members were at the convention for Mr. IJames' lecture earlier in the day.

On a down note, Kentucky Division Lieutenant Commander Buzz Childress was briefly arrested Thursday night for the "infamous" crime of hanging a Battle Flag in his hotel room window. The action was taken belligerently by the owner of the Wingate Wyndham Hotel. Immediately SCV guests of the hotel began canceling their stays, and all SCV and friends soon terminated their stays there. The convention also voted to discourage members of the SCV from doing business with the Wyndham chain and Commander Childress was given a commendation for his actions. Incidentally after he was released, he moved into the hotel next door and hung his Battle Flag in the window there without incident.

The Awards Luncheon was held on Friday at noon and awards were given to outstanding camps and Compatriots. Several members of Secession Camp received awards which will be presented at our August camp meeting.

Another interesting event at the convention was the annual John Calhoun Oratory Contest. The theme at this years contest was the "Nomination of the second President of the Confederacy." This event is usually light hearted and very entertaining. Compatriot Gene Hogan had won the contest for the past two years. see SCV Nat'l Conv. cont. p.3....

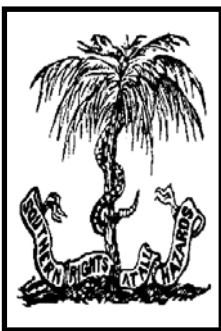

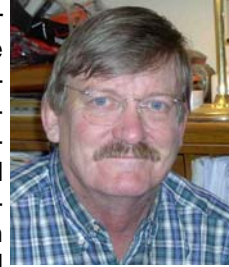

Honorary Membership Nominations

Secession Camp will take nominations for the newly created Honorary Membership Award at the August meeting. Any camp member can make a nomination for the award and the number of awards to be given is not limited. All nominations must be submitted in writing with accompanying support information, to the camp adjutant or commander and presented to the membership at the August meeting. Listed below are the guidelines as passed at the June 17, 2008 meeting. The nominees will be listed in the September newsletter and voted on at a following meeting.

1. The Honorary Membership Award will be presented by Secession Camp # 4 to members of the community who have shown an interest in the preservation of Confederate heritage through activities that promote a positive image of Confederate history to our community or the preservation of that history within the community. Recipients will have gone well beyond the ordinary in their efforts to show the Confederate soldier in a positive light to the community or in the preservation of Confederate history. Recipients will not be members of Secession Camp and need not be Southerners by birth, members of the SCV or any historical organization.
2. The award does not have to be given every year.
3. Nominations will be made at a previously announced camp meeting once a year and any camp member can nominate an individual for the award. Nominations should be accompanied by information which supports the nominee's qualifications in writing and nominees will be listed in the camp's newsletter before the vote.
4. Nominees will be voted on by the camp membership present at the meeting following the nomination meeting.
5. Nominations and voting should take place during the third quarter of the year and the award should be presented at a camp meeting during the final quarter of that year.
6. The recipient will be presented with a certificate of appreciation, a plaque, a pin, and will be eligible to attend camp meetings and events. They will be placed on the camp's newsletter e-mail list or given a one year hard copy subscription to the newsletter.
7. The award is considered a life time award.

SECESSION CAMP CHALLENGE COINS

The Camp will be ordering 100 of these beautiful color Challenge coins which will sell for \$10 each. We have already sold over 40. The coins will have been ordered by the time you get this newsletter and should arrive around the first of September. They will have three colors on the camp side which are baked-on enamel and the coin itself will be made of antique brass. The idea of a challenge coin is something that was created long ago by Confederate veterans as a means of displaying loyalty to their veterans organizations. We intend to bring this tradition back among our SCV camps by having members challenge each other to see who is carrying a camp coin and comparing each other's coins. Whether it catches on or not the coin will be a great keepsake for our members.

- SCV Charge was given by Commander Bill Norris
- Invocation given by Chaplain Sy Mabie
- Salute to the Flags given by Color Sgt. Loren O'Donnell.
- The cooks were then recognized for the meal. Head chef Don Pace was assisted by Perry Patrick, Danny Pinson, and William Helms.
- Introduction of guest.
- Commander Norris introduced our speaker, Compatriot John Whatley, who is a member of Secession Camp. He is a retired artillery officer with 23 years service in the U. S. Army. He has authored several books on TWBS as well as newspaper articles. He is a Colonel commanding the 1st Brigade Georgia State Line re-enactors. Mr. Whatley gave a brief description of the Georgia State Line unit, which were issued no uniforms and just wore ordinary clothes. His main topic was about Jewish Confederates from South Carolina and other southern states. Few Jewish Confederates owned slaves. The greatest majority were clerks, peddlers, artisans, tailors, shopkeepers, merchants, and various other professions. They had come to the South from places like Bavaria, Prussia, and all over central Europe. They were struck by their new freedom and opportunity in the South they now enjoyed and felt they had an obligation to repay that gift with their service to the Confederacy. On January 5, 1861, Jefferson Davis and eleven southern senators met in Washington to pledge their loyalty to the new Confederacy, Two of these senators, Judah Benjamin from Louisiana and David Levy Yulee from Florida were Jewish. Major Adolph Proskauer was a Jew who left Prussia for Mobile and led the 12th Alabama Infantry in the attack of Culp's Hill at Gettysburg. Octavus Cohen of Savannah fought at Secessionville in June of 1862, then returned in 1863 as a Lieutenant in Company G of the 32nd Georgia to help defend Charleston. Colonel Leon Dawson Marks, who was one of the highest ranking Jewish Confederates, helped construct the defenses at Vicksburg where he was later mortally wounded. Abraham Charles Myers, an 1833 graduate of West Point served as Quartermaster General of the Confederacy. He was also the great grandson of the first Rabbi of Beth Elohim Synagogue in Charleston, which is the oldest Reform Jewish Synagogue in the nation. One of Secession Camps associate members, Michael Kogen is a descendant of the Rabbi and Mr. Myers. Following his talk, Compatriot Whatley was given a standing ovation by the Camp.
- Commander Norris announced that camp member, Glenn Moncus had died on July 7th and was buried at his home in Georgia. Glenn's daughter, Jennifer, attended the Sam Davis Youth Camp in 2007.
- Treasurers Report: Buck Perry reported a beginning balance of \$8,241.46 with deposits of \$1,586.00 several checks were written for postage, SCV Headquarters, SCV Division, and for the quartermaster trailer which left a balance of \$9,827.46.
Mickey Davis Fund: Woody Weatherford reported a beginning balance of \$1,888.08 with a deposit of \$116.00 from the June meal an outstanding check for the Sam Davis Youth Camp for \$495.00. Balance after the June meeting was \$2,004.08.
- Chaplains Report: Sy Mabie reported that Joe Davis continues to improve as well as Tom Gelwicks wife George Young reported that Willie Heidtman is also improving.
- Highway Cleanup: Michael Dixon reported the next highway cleanup will be on September 6th.

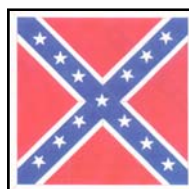

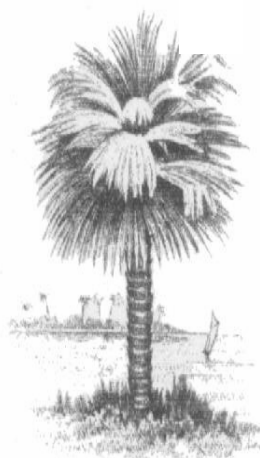
