This unique program will allow the South Carolina Division to cordially greet the attendees of the Stephen Dill Lee Institute and show the hospitality made famous by Charlestonians and South Carolinians in general. Our guests will enjoy light hors d'oeuvres and music. The Stephen Dill Lee speakers will be in attendance to meet our guests, sign books and talk history in a casual and relaxed atmosphere. This cost is \$25.00 with all proceeds going to the Stephen Dill Lee Scholarship Program, for students to attend. A cash bar will also be provided.
