CONFEDERATE SOLDIER GRAVES DESECRATED IN ALABAMA

I recently had an article forwarded to me by 2nd Lt. Commander John Waring from the Southern Heritage News and Views-Heritage Alert web blog. This article was published in the Dothan Eagle (Alabama) on April 24th, 2009 and to be perfectly honest, after reading this article I became sick to my stomach, then the outrage set in. This sad state of affairs began when UDC member Mary Norman observed Auburn Councilman Arthur L. Dowdell remove the Confederate flag that had been placed on the grave of her Great Grandfather and in her words "snapped it in half." Mrs. Norman was obviously shocked and to realize an elected councilman was committing this heinous and disrespectful act really hit home. Councilman Dowdell denies snapping the flag in half, he had no denial of removing several other Confederate Battle flags he saw at Pine Hill Cemetery in Auburn. The UDC had placed the flags on Confederate soldier plots earlier in the week just as they had done for over 50 years. Though Mrs. Norman did not place the flags, she was onsite with a friend taking inventory of Confederate graves at Pine Hill Cemetery when Councilman Dowdell asked her who had placed the flags on plots in the cemetery. He then, reported by Mrs. Norman, became very upset and pulled up the flag on her Great Grandfather's grave. Dowdell then denied snapping the flag. His response was, "If it did, so what? If I had my way, I would have broke them all up and stomped on them and burned them. That flag represents another country, another nation." Yes Councilman, it represents another country and nation that respects their fallen warriors!

CAMP SPEAKER FOR THE MAY 19TH MEETING

The Camp speaker for May is History Professor Peter Bergen. Below are some biographical facts sent to us by Mr. Bergen.

I was born in Nijmegen, southern part of the Netherlands on 9-5-1948 and educated as a history teacher for Secondary Education and actively worked in the educational field from 1971-2007 uninterupted. In 1962 I entered Secondary High School, passed examination (in 20 subjects ranging from three languages, history, geography, science, mathematics, economics-those were the days in the Netherlands when you got a broad and deep education in all fields of life!) in 1966 and followed up by entering the five year studies at the "Academy for Pedagogical and Didactical Studies" (the former Teacher's Training College dep of the University). Next to the basic studies I specialised in Dutch and English Language and Cultural studies and History. In that particular field I specialised in Dutch and British History, American History and China and Vietnam. I taught at St Mary's from 1971-1983, the Rainbow from 1983-1996, both in my hometown and birthplace Nijmegen and the EFO College, in Amsterdam from 1996-2007.

I was heavily influenced in history by both Daddy and Granddaddy. They showed me the southern ways of history...



THE NEXT CAMP MEETING WILL BE MAY 19TH



The Battle of Chancellorsville, May 1-3, 1863. Gen. Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson leads Some 26,000 war hardened Confederates around the Federal lines, which numbered approximately 115,000, and flanks the Federal 10th Core. The lack of daylight was the only thing that could Jackson as he ordered his boys to "Press on!". His zeal for finding the Federal rear continued into the night. Jackson's entourage was mistaken for Yankee cavalry and several N.C. regiments fired, hitting Jackson. After having his left arm amputated, he would succumb to pneumonia just days later.
